This month, USCIS released myE-Verify, a new employee-focused website. Visit www.uscis.gov/myE-Verify to use its exciting features:

- myE-Verify accounts: free secure personal accounts are now available in Arizona, Idaho, Colorado, Mississippi, Virginia and the District of Columbia, and will eventually be released nationwide.
- Self Lock: lets myE-Verify account holders lock their social security numbers to prevent unauthorized or fraudulent use within E-Verify; this protects your identity.
- myResources: a creative multi-media resource center to learn about employee rights and employer responsibilities.
- Self Check: the free service you can use to confirm your own employment eligibility and get instructions to update your records, if necessary. Available nationwide and in [Spanish](#).

Extension of Employment Authorized Documents (EADs) for Qualified Nationals

USCIS recently announced the automatic extension of employment authorization for the following nationals under [Temporary Protected Status \(TPS\)](#) or [Deferred Enforced Departure \(DED\)](#):

Nationals of	EAD Expiration Date	Auto-Extension To
Sudan and South Sudan with TPS	November 2, 2014	May 2, 2015
Liberia with DED	September 30, 2014	March 30, 2015
Honduras and Nicaragua with TPS	January 5, 2015	July 5, 2015

I-9 Tip: In Puerto Rico? Use Spanish Form I-9

Employers located in Puerto Rico can complete and retain the [Spanish language version of Form I-9](#). Employers located outside of Puerto Rico can give workers a Spanish copy as a reference but must complete and retain the [English language Form I-9](#).
