Q: What should a company do if a natural disaster or any other unforeseen occurrence destroys its stored copies of the Forms I-9, Employment Eligibility Verification?

A: Employers whose Forms I-9 are missing and/or destroyed as a result of a natural disaster or any other unforeseen occurrence should complete new Forms I-9 as soon as reasonably possible.
